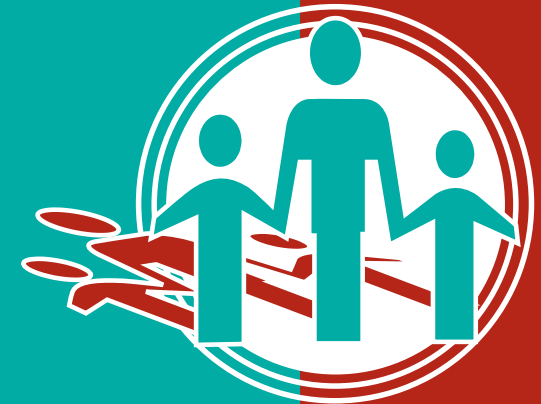

DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAMS AND SERVICES


CHILD AND FAMILY INTERVENTION

-  Child and Family Intervention is the core mental health treatment program, comprising assessment, treatment planning and implementation, termination and follow-up, within a multidisciplinary and case management approach. Treatment may include therapy for the child/adolescent and their family, social skills group therapy.


CHILDREN'S MOBILE CRISIS PROGRAM

-  The Children's Mobile Crisis Program offers a 24 hrs / 7 days a week telephone crisis intervention service and a bilingual 12 hours / 7 days a week face to face crisis intervention service. A child or youth in crisis can call HRSRH Crisis Intervention Program, to speak directly with a professional. A risk assessment will be completed, support will be provided, and the person will be directed to appropriate resources.


DAY TREATMENT PROGRAMS

-  Provide clinical intervention to the classroom, jointly established with the local Boards of Education to serve students with social, emotional or behavioral difficulties.

EARLY YEARS MENTAL HEALTH 0-6


-  Early Years Mental Health addresses mental health problems with children, from birth to six years of age, and their families with intensive, flexible mental health treatment services in their homes, schools and communities. Individual child therapy, family based or group based treatment all address child development and parenting skill development.

DEVELOPMENTAL CLINICAL AND COMMUNITY SUPPORT SERVICES


-  To provide psychological assessments and clinical supports and services for children/youth with suspected or diagnosed Global Developmental Disability (GDD). These services include diagnostics, clinical assessments, consultations and interventions to meet behavioural/mental health needs as required.




INTENSIVE CHILD AND FAMILY INTERVENTION

-  The Intensive Child and Family Intervention program provides children with severe behaviours with intensive, flexible mental health treatment services in their home, schools and/or communities through Child and Youth Worker services attached to a Child and Family Team.

KIDS' SHARE / ENFANTS-PARTAGE, OUR PREVENTION PROGRAM

-  This Early Years Satellite includes a parent resource program and a mobile toy lending library which visits several housing complexes on a regular basis. It also offers several different parenting programs, parent discussion groups, early literacy, school readiness workshops as well as community referral services.

OUTREACH PROGRAM

-  The Outreach Program provides mental health treatment to children/youth who are non-compliant and resistant to engage in traditional mental health services. These children/youth present with externalising behaviours such as oppositional defiance, aggression and conduct problems.

*The Child and Family Centre operates the **Family Intervention and Support Program (FISP)** and the **Therapeutic Foster Care Program**, a long term residential program, in partnership with the Children's Aid Society of the Districts of Sudbury and Manitoulin.*

*CFC operates an **Intensive Support and Supervision Program (ISSP)** which brings together workers from the children's mental health, youth justice and developmental sectors to address some of the underlying causes of youth crime. Services provided include an alternative to custody that is open to the judge at the time of sentencing, intensive clinical support and community supervision and a community and team approach that focuses on treatment.*

*CFC also operates the **Supervised Access Program** under contract with the Ministry of the Attorney General.*
